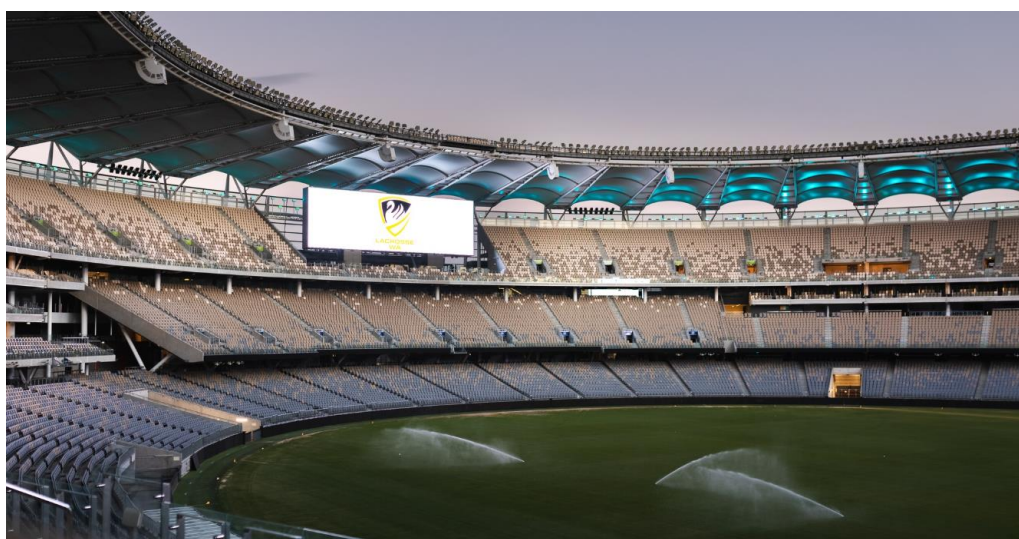

2024 WA Men's Box Lacrosse State Team National Champions

Western Australia's Box Men claimed a thrilling National Championship that had it all from scorching temperatures, thrilling play, big hits, golden goals and most importantly, some of the best box lacrosse ever seen in Australia.

Western Australia took home the Mollison Cup for a second time after claiming a thrilling Championship Final which saw 2 goals wiped off in the dying minutes before the game was won in golden goal.

The Men's final was one of the all-time great lacrosse games with the lead changing on multiple occasions. When WA extended their lead to 3 with 5 minutes to go, things looked over but Victoria stormed back to tie the game late. Both sides then scored in the last minute but had those goals wiped off for a variety of reasons which allowed Lucas Wood to score a famous goal for Western Australia.

2024 WA Women's State Team (Field) National Champions

Western Australia have claimed their first Women's National Championship in six years roaring past Victoria to claim the title and conclude the 2024 LA Women's National Championship. Victoria started the stronger of the sides, with a 6 - 3 before Ashtyn Hiron scored late in the half to cut the margin to 1 at the main break. However, the half time break worked wonders for Western Australia who came out all guns blazing with Kate Hooper and Holly Plummer spurring a 6 - 0 run which turned the game on its head. WA then scored the first 3 goals of the last to make it 14 - 6 before Victoria got a couple back. However, led by MVP Baillie Keenan, WA would not be troubled again as WA won by 8 claiming the title in front of their home fans.

Western Australia reclaimed the Men's National Championship with a big win over South Australia. SA started the stronger of the sides, scoring the opening 2 goals of the game but WA eventually found a way through the tight SA defence to get back on level terms. The depth of WA's offence slowly got on top with a 4-goal second term and 5-goal third breaking any resistance. WA MVP Rhett Johnstone snuffed out any chance of an SA comeback with some great work between the pipes. The last quarter became academic as WA continued to add goals with Western Australia recording a 7 goal final term to the delight of the home crowd.

2024 DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT & GROWTH REPORT

Paul Buckman

In 2024, the imperative for lacrosse is to grow junior playing numbers.

If this stands true and if this is really and collectively our number one priority, which it should be, then Lacrosse WA (LWA), each lacrosse club, their boards and their members must reflect on how well their growth activities are really resourced with people, time and money. To grow participation numbers there must be a rebalancing of the limited resources each club has, towards growth activities, as growth in player numbers will solve most problems being faced by the sport.

Alignment of Strategic Outcomes

2024 has again been a successful year for the LWA Growth and Development portfolio with all clubs reaffirming their alignment and commitment to working collectively and cohesively to:

1. Increase awareness, engagement, participation in lacrosse to build player numbers and club membership,
2. Create and deliver high quality competitions, in Quickstix, Box, Sixers and Field Lacrosse,
3. Support the sharing of knowledge and actions to grow each Clubs capacity, ability and success in growing player numbers,
4. Implement and embed Quickstix Lacrosse programs within each club as a foundational element to grow player numbers.

LWA Working Groups – Actions being agreed and delivered

Throughout 2024, the Director of Growth and Development proposed and developed working groups (made up of skill-based club members) to deliver on key LWA strategic initiatives through:

1. **U11 Working Group** – This group brings together all U11 club coaches, Western Australian Lacrosse Officials (WALO) reps and LWA to discuss, agree and then implement the U11 Manual and growth actions for the U11 competition.
 2. **Growth Working Group** – all clubs are represented by several members, each with growth and development skills, to share and discuss growth strategies, successes and some failures, so that each club can develop, implement and report back on its own growth action plan. This also connects into the Lacrosse Australia (LA) Growth Working Group.
 3. **Concussion Working Group** – building on the foundational work of previous LWA Director Caitlin Ryan, there has been significant engagement with LA, LWA, WALO and Club Presidents to grow awareness of the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) – Australian Concussion Guidelines for Youth and Community Sport, resulting in a unanimous agreement by clubs to implement these guidelines in 2025. This also connects into the LA Concussion Working Group.
-

4. **Gameday Working Group** – just recently formed to support those clubs with knowledge sharing about the use and working of the Gameday software package, particularly with concussion reporting and Quickstix events.
5. **Relax “Down South” Working Group** – formed to plan and deliver this LWA annual Sixer Lacrosse event. In 2024 we have seen a jump from 3 members to 14 members keen to grow the success and impact of this regional event. The 2025 event is looking exciting!

2024 Highlights

1. Alignment of LWA and Club growth actions towards LA's National Participation Framework.
2. All clubs supporting, promoting and delivering LA's Quickstix program.
3. Launch of Sixes Lacrosse as a separate form of lacrosse – Relax 6's Tournament, Elite Sixers Tournament and Major League Sixes tournament.
4. Positive negotiations with Western Australian Lacrosse Officials (WALO) on equalisation of pay rates, management of player and sideline behaviours, concussion management and junior game officiating and officials training by WALO.
5. Continued risk management approach with Child Safety, Concussion and Growth in Playing numbers being the areas of continued and growing focus.

Quickstix Lacrosse - Our biggest growth initiative needs our full attention and more resources

Learning about it with LA, LWA and other clubs, introducing and building the profile of the Quickstix program, and then introducing it into schools has been a goal and growth outcome of LWA over the last 4 years.

There is now a solid base to launch from and build a coordinated and larger Quickstix Lacrosse program based at each club. This program would be the main feeder program into our Lacrosse - Field, Sixer and Box competition teams.



The Quickstix Lacrosse program includes the following development elements:

1. Quickstix **Inform** – Introduce Quickstix to schools.
2. Quickstix **Involve** – 5 week school based program offered to both primary and high schools, schools pay via Sporting Schools Australia funding, LA and LWA manage and coordinate coaches and delivery.
3. **Interschool Tournaments** – interschool carnivals.
4. Quickstix **Invade** – promoted via social media, at schools and at the interschool tournaments and is hosted by a Club at their grounds, \$50 for 5 x 1 hour session for 5 weeks.
5. Club based, non travelling Quickstix/Modcrosse competition.

As this program builds it will lead to a pipeline of junior players into junior lacrosse – securing a pathway to U11s travel teams.

Does it work

The 2 biggest junior player clubs in Australia (Williamstown and Wanneroo Joondalup), both use this 5 step process to build engagement and participation in their programs.

To ensure continued delivery and to grow the impact of the Quickstix Program in WA it needs, more people involved, a program coordinator (LWA and at each Club), Quickstix trained coaches, marketing and promotion and to be operated by the clubs like a business.

Growing in 2025 and beyond – What does success look like?

Together, we need to focus our resources to build a wider player base and grow our pipeline of young lacrosse players to secure and build long term success of our senior programs and clubs.

I will continue to challenge LA, LWA and each Club to match this priority of growth with the required sustained resources to deliver results.

For me success for each club looks like:

- Quickstix Invade program is offered by each club, each term and delivered to growing numbers of participants.
- Each club has a non-travelling Quickstix competition, with growing numbers.
- Each club has 6 x U11 teams.
- Each club has 4 x u13/14 teams.
- Measuring and sharing our growth metrics with each other.

I understand it's a privilege to be a LWA Director, chair and be involved in several working groups and to work with all of their dedicated members to achieve our shared vision of a growing the sport of lacrosse.



2024 DIRECTOR OF HIGH PERFORMANCE REPORT

International Representation

The U20 Women's World Cup in Hong Kong was a proud moment for WA, with Ocea Leavy (Vice Captain) and Holly Plummer showcasing outstanding skills on the field. Ocea stood out as Australia's highest scorer, contributing to the team's 4th-place finish after a closely contested bronze medal match.

WA's representation extended beyond players, with officials Kellie Morley, Julie Ames, and Susan Milne officiating, Chloe Tatlow serving as Statistician, and Faye Beaman managing the team.

At the Women's Box Lacrosse World Championships in Attica, NY, history was made as women competed for the first time. WA athletes Kate Hooper, Emma Green, Olivia Wills, Natasha Bronkhorst, Tegan Brown, Posy O'Keefe, Georgia Portlock, Zowie Day and assistant coach Shendelle Oliver played a pivotal role in the team's 4th-place finish—an extraordinary achievement for an inaugural team.

The Men's Box Lacrosse team also boasted strong WA representation, including Matt Wood, Lucas Wood, Ryan Hockey, Benjamin Muxlow, Lucas Deshon, Ashby Dennis, and Brayden Panting. Luke Oliver served as gate operator, and Max Sadka supported both teams as physio.

State Representation

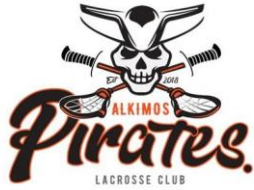

Quickstix

The 108 registrations does not include players with standard season registrations who we allow to participate at no extra cost in the term 2 and 3 programs. Each program commences the second Tuesday of the school term.

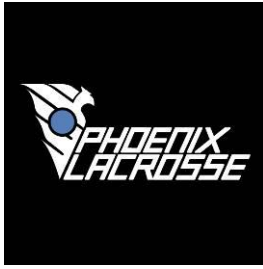
In closing I'm extremely proud and grateful to all players, supporters, officials and the greater lacrosse community for all their efforts, support and willingness to make the season as successful as it was.

As a club we were focussed on developing our junior programs this year. We were able to start after school programs in Term 1 with Nedlands Primary and Subiaco Primary. Highlights

1. Division 2 membership

This year we had Division 2 men's and women's teams entered. The addition of a Division 2 men's team brought back many of our previous U17 players to play seniors, and kept many of our older Division 3 players around as well. Despite the unfortunate results from the D2 men this year, the number of players on game day was an encouraging sign of things to come. We also had a large number of new girls in the Division 2 women's team. It was fantastic to watch these girls grow in skill and confidence through the year.

2. School Programs

Areas of Improvement

Similar to many years previous, we have struggled to maintain and improve our junior membership. We had 30 junior players registered for the 2024 season which is a 42% increase from 2023, however is still not enough to field teams in all grades. In particular there is a major gap in the number of junior girls we have registered. We have recently started a development subcommittee with members committed to finding new ways to encourage primary school aged kids to take up lacrosse/modcrosse. We hope that this will prove fruitful in the coming years.

Key actions:

- Collaborate with local schools to create opportunities for kids to try lacrosse at school
 - Advertise further to kids and parents through local schools with in-person training or games, as well as flyers
 - Continue to grow on social media platforms to encourage kids to play
 - Purchase more equipment to allow for easier participation
 - Engage the U11 age group to support a team in this age bracket next year

- Continue to develop at modcrosse program in collaboration with Wembley

2. Training Numbers

The number of players attending juniors training and Division 2 men's training were particularly low at points this year. There are a number of factors that may contribute to this, however it does deter new players. Changing the culture around training and encouraging all members to come despite poor weather, or other factors is important in maintaining the current membership but also encouraging new members to come down.

Key actions

- Grow our junior contingency to encourage higher numbers of participants at training
- Discuss with senior club members prior to season their commitment to training
- Involve coaches early in the season to provide structure to training
- Liaise with the council to ensure consistent training fields all season
- Monthly senior dinners after training to encourage people to come down

3. Social Events

With the season being shorter this year, and with the addition of 6s games, night games, and hosting women's on Sundays, we lacked many social events this year. In previous years, social events have been a strong suit for the club and increased the sense of community between members.

Key actions

- Create a fortnightly or monthly newsletter to engage with the current community
- Encourage support of the club via social events
- Support committee members in creating events by delegating tasks
- Be active on social media and via email regarding social events
- Cooperate with LWA to have fixtures earlier in the year, and encourage double header fixtures

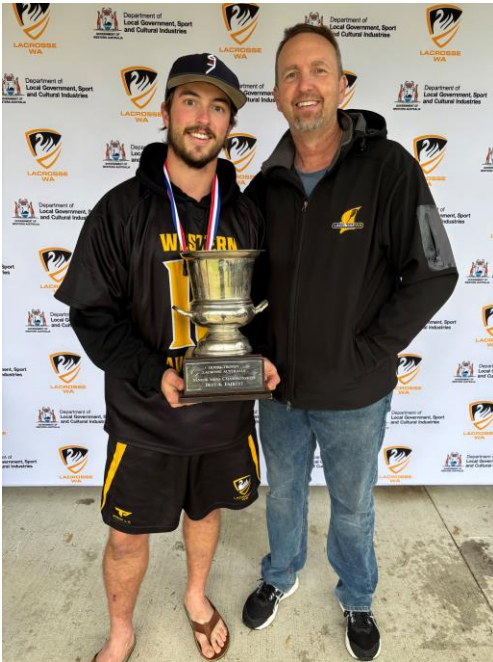

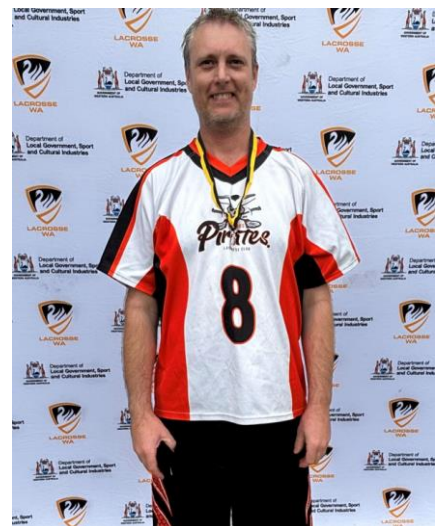

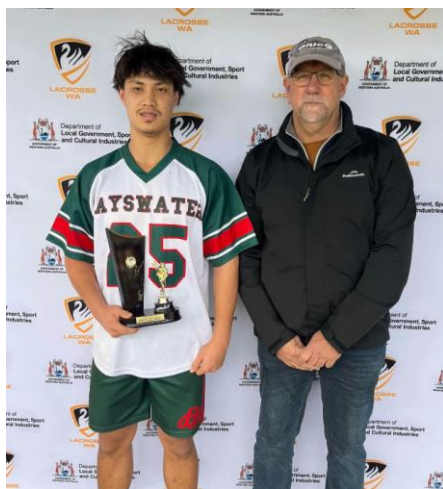
