2010 PRESIDENTS REPORT – GARY KENNEDY

It gives me great pleasure to present the first presidents report for the newly formed Lacrosse WA (formerly WALA and Lacrosse West) and would like to thank everyone for their support in bringing together the two bodies. While the 2010 year has been a transition year with minimal changes on the surface the board has been mindful of ensuring equity of both groups and respecting the past histories of both associations.

I would like to thank all the club presidents (including ALRA WA) for their support and commitment in working with the LWA board and I'm happy to report that all clubs have now unified. The main focus of the board this year has worked on consolidating the unification and working with our two major sponsors Healthway and Department of Sports and Recreation to ensure that the newly formed body maintained its funding. This has been achieved for the next two seasons thanks to the efforts of Peta Hiron and Ellen Kennedy.

Sporting Pulse has continued as a primary source of keeping the lacrosse community (all over the world) informed of the progress of the competition. For the first time the women's competition is now running under this site although a little slow getting going it is now up and operating. While most clubs embraced the concept some areas of clubs struggled to maintain up to date information which should be a target for clubs to improve in 2011. Special thanks must go to Michael Gates for his tireless work in setting up and maintaining the records on the site.

Phoenix Lacrosse club continued in their return to the competition with the inclusion of women's A Grade team and winning the C Grade women's premiership. There is still a lot of work to be done but under the direction of some very enthusiastic members working with the LWA things are slowly coming together, I cannot understate the need to support the Phoenix club in getting the club back to a strong force in all grades but I think the club need to seriously need to look at relocating to a new area in the south east corridor.

The introduction of a new junior club in the CanningVale area and the second season of the Baldivis club (both under the umbrella of the East Fremantle club) prove that the game can expand to new areas and I encourage other clubs to look at satellite areas to grow the game. I would like to thank all those Under 13 teams that played the CanningVale team during the season in the right spirit and helped them in developing.

The junior council continues to run well and thanks must go to Kevin McRae for his years of tireless effort in maintaining this valuable subcommittee.

One of the great success's for the 2010 year was the awards evening which was held at the Hillary Yacht Club, the venue was excellent and the support from the lacrosse community was outstanding with over 200 people attending, a special thanks needs to go to our co hosts Jane Rowlands and Timothy Kennedy who did an outstanding job hosting the evening and proves we do not need to look outside our own people to run these types of events. I have it on good advice that Tim and Jane have already started planning for next year's presentation. Events like this do not come together without people behind the scenes and I would like to thank Karen Mau (who took holidays and missed out on all her good work) and Ellen Kennedy for putting this all together.

Congratulations to all award winners in the Junior and Senior grades and a special mention to the first Life Member under the LWA banner Ken Sugars I would like to thank Ross Whiteman for his presentation to Ken at the awards night and the due respect shown by all at the evening when the award was presented.

Some of the new initiatives that were introduced this year were the presentation of the Kuljak medal for the Women's A grade grand final, the introduction of the Women's all star team at the presentation evening.

The season on a whole has been very successful with the makeup of the finals not decided to the very last game in some grades, Subiaco and the Director of Women's Operations (through his working party) ran a great finals series with a total of five clubs winning premierships in nine grades (no premiership in women's D grade).

The state and regional teams performed well in national's arena. Congratulations to the Southern Braves winning the Under 15s Australian Tournament (third year in a row) and the Boy's Under 17 state team winning the nationals. Well done to Murray Gates who coached both of these teams as well as the Girls under 21s team. The senior women's team also should be commended on an outstanding effort finishing on top of the ladder at the end of the round robin series and only just fell short in the finals.

One disappointing aspect of the 2010 season was inability to put together a state senior men's team, there are many reasons for this World Series year, finances etc but the game should not revolve around so few players this should be seen as an opportunity for those on the fringe to show they are ready to take the next step.

Congratulation to the WA representatives in the Australian team who travelled to England for the Senior Men's World Championship. While they did not make it to the gold medal game they did win the bronze medal maintaining our world ranking in a competition that is growing at a rapid rate with the minor countries improving challenging our status. The WA contingent was, John Denic Head Coach, Gavin Leavy Assistant Coach, Rod Sear Manager, Adam Sear, Alex Brown, Sam Williams, Glen Morley, Jimmy Galbraith Watson and Gareth Allen.

The major challenge facing lacrosse into the future is combining the processes of running the game, expanding to new areas including regional WA, increasing costs for state and regional teams travelling teams, increase the standard of coaching within WA and increase the number of Referee's/Umpires to list a few .

I would like to thank all the board members for their tireless efforts and support throughout the year. While I will be standing down at the AGM I would like to thank LWA (also the previous WALA boards) for the honor of being the president and I encourage lacrosse members past and present to get behind this great game of ours. I wish the new board all the best and I personally look forward taking on a new challenge within lacrosse in the 2011 season.

I take this opportunity to wish you all a good break, Merry Xmas and a Happy New Year and remind you the 2011 season is not that far away and we need to start planning now.

Final comment: If all lacrosse members put in just 1% of their time to the running of the game we can improve the running of the game by over 1,000% if you leave it to the LWA/Club boards then the game will stagnate.

2010 VICE PRESIDENTS REPORT- MICHAEL FERGUSON

The past year was the first season of a new era for our sport. Lacrosse WA now administers both Women's and Men's Lacrosse in Western Australia, bringing us into line with the International and National bodies and the other major States.

The amalgamation is still in its infancy and we are in many respects still feeling our way. I am confident that with the right people, respect and goodwill Lacrosse WA will be effective in promoting both aspects of our game in the State.

After a year in which increasing work commitments interfered drastically with the amount of time and attention I was able to devote to Lacrosse WA, I have decided that unfortunately I am not able to continue in a role for the association for the next few years. Because of these other commitments, I was unable to adequately assist the President and other directors in running the sport. Particularly, I could not lend support to the critical area of development which must remain our most important focus, but may require a change in emphasis if we are to grow our sport and see it achieve the widespread awareness and popularity that it should have.

In that vein, on Sunday I was privileged to be at a breakfast organised by the City of Fremantle to recognise the contribution that sporting clubs and volunteers make to the community. Various awards were made, including the junior female sports star to Riley Magee, from Phoenix Lacrosse Club. Awards such as these will help in a small way to raise the profile of our sport and I encourage all clubs to seek out opportunities to promote our players and our sport.

In future I recommend that the role of Vice President should be one in which the holder (while deputising for the President when necessary) has a specific focus for the year. While that focus will change, I cannot emphasis enough that development of our sport is of fundamental importance and warrants the attention of one of the senior offices in the Association.

Finally, I would like to thank the President and other members of the Board during 2010 for their tolerance and support and also mention the sterling efforts of Ellen Kennedy in the Lacrosse office.

 I would personally like to thank the Lacrosse WA board members for being so understanding, major sponsors DSR (Kendra) and Healthway (Amy), Peta you have taken on development, Karen Mau for organising a Great Senior Presentation night, Michael Gates for doing the DO payments with minimal complaints and lastly my husband Gary Kennedy for all the advice and listening to me. A BIG THANK YOU TO ALL LACROSSE MEMBERS.

2010 DIRECTOR OF MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT-NATHAN RAINEY

I feel it necessary to first congratulate Gary Kennedy on his tenure as president of Lacrosse WA and wish him all the best with his endeavours within the lacrosse community as his role changes and diversify into different areas. His work load and efforts with the merge of the men's and women's lacrosse organisations was largely behind the scenes and unnoticed by the lacrosse community as a whole.

I would also like to thank the complete board of Lacrosse WA for their efforts this year and support given to me, as I took up the role mid-year, also to Bill Barton who undertook the fixtures of the final series and the men's season fixtures. Whilst also being the club president of Subiaco who hosted the finals series, which were a great spectacle to all those who attended. I'm sure Bill's support will be missed by myself (and the board) next year if he does not commit again.

I would like to commend the efforts of all those involved with the representative teams at world level from players through to administration with WA very well represented through all teams, also to coaching and management volunteers who assisted and travelled with the numerous junior and senior teams participating in their respective age groups across state championships, with special mention to Murray Gates for taking out the double of U/15 and U/17 state championship as coach. On the down side was the lack of support from players to the men's senior team this year with WA unable to send a representative side. This will be high on my agenda of areas that require my attention next year and encourage any member of the lacrosse community to offer their opinion, ideas or strategies to rectify the lack of player support in this area.

As Lacrosse continues to evolve and change shape within the club spectrum there needs to be a growing level of communication between clubs and the Lacrosse WA board and administration. There is a stigma which seems to be limiting the growth and evolution of Lacrosse due to this breakdown of communication. As clubs grow (hopefully) their membership and the sport aims to increase its awareness within the community, with school programmes and other initiatives, the need for clarity and review of all processes is of vital importance. This will always come back to the ability of the Lacrosse WA board to carry out its tasks with the knowledge that all clubs have submitted their feedback or that the proposed activities will be supported by clubs. This starts with Lacrosse WA sending out appropriate information to club secretaries and that information is being discussed by club committees and representatives. There is a breakdown at every club with the information coming from Lacrosse WA not making its way to committee members, with the return feedback not making its way back to Lacrosse WA.

I would encourage all club committees and members to utilise the recourse of Lacrosse WA. In particular as junior numbers become harder to maintain and reproduce year after year; Peta Hiron has set new standards with her approaches to gaining broader community awareness of Lacrosse and is devolving strong ties with many schools and organisations within them. These can only be partially managed by DO's etc. but the opportunities for clubs to work in conjunction with Peta in these areas is sorely lacking. There is a lack of support within all clubs with respect to junior recruitment, so my suggestion is team up and increases your junior numbers.

In closing I would like to remind all players and retired players of the fact that all clubs only exist on the support of its members and like most clubs this falls on too few, every club has its hard working groups which seem to do everything, step back take a look and offer your support. We are all here because of the efforts that others have made previously, at club and board level. Many players would not be aware that Lacrosse needs to grow itself, starting from within for the sport to prosper. Everyone is busy......eventually there will be no one left.

2010 DIRECTOR OF WOMEN'S LACROSSE- DENNIS BANYARD

2010 was a challenging year for Lacrosse in WA being the first year of the amalgamation and the myriad of adjustments this has entailed. My aim was to ensure that we had a well run Women's competition which did not show any negatives from the amalgamation. This was not a complete success. This role requires a very hands on approach with availability during the week and I was unable to consistently achieve this with some tasks unfulfilled and some late.

Routines at Board level are very established and it has generally been that if there are differences in policy or practice between the two halves of the game it is assumed that the men's processes will continue because that has been "the way we do it". Generally this has not been a major problem and I'm sure is not a conscious decision but we run the risk of our smaller women's game becoming a very junior partner.

Part of this process is fine tuning the Board's role which now should only be dealing with matters which affect both halves of the game (e.g. Relationship with ALAL, Promotion of the game,

Development processes etc) and not the day to day processes involved in each half of the game. We haven't had time this year to put together the combined approach we need for many of these processes. This needs to be the Board's priority for the off-season.

I would like to thank the Women's subcommittee for the all their efforts this year which has made my role manageable. Thank you to Faye Beaman for looking after a very large part of the day to day business particularly managing Light St, Angie Somerville for looking after the Junior programme, Adele Ackland managing State team issues, Suzanne Kirkby running all Umpiring business, Peta Hiron with the biggest job on the Board (Development) and also a myriad of tasks at every level of women's lacrosse and finally Karen Mau who was also on the Board (Promotions) and continued to do lots for the running of the women's side. Thank you all for your awesome commitment to Lacrosse.

2010 DIRECTOR OF OFFICIATIONS REPORT – EVAN WALTERS

2010 has been another big year in Australian Lacrosse with the amalgamation of Women's and Men's Lacrosse in Western Australia and the Men's World Championships

The new Board of Lacrosse in WA this year has had a momentous task at hand and I congratulate them on a job done well

This year has been tough for the Men's Referee's with their numbers dropping by 3 members and no new people coming through , the Women's Referee's are a group that never seem to change with clubs doing their bit to get a thankless job done and I take my hat off to them in doing this well yet again

With the Men's World Championships held in Manchester, England we took a bit of a tumble in numbers left behind in the local competition with 2 Referee's Officiating and 1 Referee Assessor travelling for this event

It was positive year with 2 Women's Umpires and 2 Men's Referee's in the same accommodation in Melbourne where the joint Women's / Men's Australian Lacrosse Championships were held at Footscray Hockey Club and what a wonderful spectacle of lacrosse it was with Women and Men sharing a common goal of competing in lacrosse at an elite level of competition

The week for me was a great experience as you get to see after many years away from Women's Lacrosse the game being played (different to what I remember) and how the Women's Umpires are treated and respected by the players from other states as well as seeing how their process of assessment and on field communication is so much different to the Men's game

I spoke with ALA Director Shelley Maher and how she see's the Women's Umpiring of Lacrosse developing in Australia and what sort of format they would like to see the Women adopt from the Men's game in the assessment process to game management and the game mechanics for Women's Umpires in Australia after the 2011 Women's Under 19 World Cup

From all reports I believe that the women's Grand Final was a great game to watch and had a great deal of skill and talent involved not only from the players but from the Umpires as they let them play a thrilling game

All in all it has been another great year of lacrosse and look forward to another exiting year next year with the challenges of getting Women Lacrosse Umpire's at a level where the rest of the states want to come here and umpire

The Men's finals were held at the Subiaco Lacrosse Club, ALRA WA was there to support the junior Referee's as bench officials

The State League Grand Final was won by Wembley in a great encounter of lacrosse with rivals East Fremantle, this game was well supported by the lead up games in which Subiaco took the spoils in Div 2 ,Wembley again triumphant in Div 3 , Wanneroo in the 17's , Bayswater in 15's and Wembley 13's

2010 DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT- PETA HIRON

This year has been a busy year for the development of lacrosse with the amalgamation of men's and women's associations, the preparation of two funding acquittal reports for Lacrosse West and WALA, and the application for new funding from Healthway for Lacrosse WA.

Lacrosse WA was successful in securing Healthway funding for the next 3 years to continue the school modcrosse program. There have however, been some changes to Healthway sponsorships. Some of our responsibilities to Healthway include providing smoke free environment, reducing harm from alcohol and preventing overweight and obesity. Along with these responsibilities come some restrictions. For example, any co-sponsorship with alcohol and food companies will be carefully scrutinised to ensure that it is appropriate, and Healthway must approve any proposal to enter into any new sponsorship during our term of agreement with Healthway.

Lacrosse WA must also address Healthway's target populations, some of which include youth, rural areas, indigenous and disadvantaged populations. Lacrosse WA must engage with these priority groups, otherwise further funding may not be granted. Yearly reporting on our progress is mandatory before our next funding is allocated. Clubs must consider these areas when looking at target groups for their club, and must also be open to sending their development officers out of their area. Many clubs do have members who live out of the area, so this may be achievable.

Currently Lacrosse WA does satisfy most of Healthway's requirements and priority groups, but there is room to improve in some areas.

Lacrosse WA also received a small funding grant from Celebrate WA for WA Week in October. This was used to run a modcrosse carnival in Canning Vale. Thank you to Anne Mare Hall for her assistance with this day. I encourage clubs to access these types of grants themselves to run their own lacrosse day.

A forum in May with club members interested in developing our modcrosse and junior numbers provided good feedback and gave an opportunity for clubs to share ideas.

Development officers presented modcrosse sessions in approximately 50 primary schools and 11 high schools this year. Other activities included:

- Lightning carnivals Tompkins Parks, Sutherland Park Canning vale, Troy Park, Kingsway (3), Atwell, Cambridge Cup Floreat.
- Country work –Pinjarra, Mundijong, Byford, Toodyay Corporate Cup.
- Vacation/Holiday Clinics Joondalup ECU, Kingsway, Challenge, Forrestfield, Craigie, Quinns.
- Canning Vale Modcrosse Day-with shopping centre display at Livingstone Shopping Centre.
- Junior Sports Expo Kwinana, Rockingham, Bayswater.
- Edmund Rice Centre –lacrosse sessions with newly arrived refugees.
- Communicare- lacrosse sessions with Islamic school.
- Student teacher training at ECU Joondalup.

I would like to thank all the development officers who conducted sessions at schools and carnivals. Special thanks go to Anne Marie Hall, Matt Devoy and Pauline Donaldson who did various work around the whole metropolitan area and some country areas. Many schools request lacrosse sessions and it is important we try to reach those areas outside club boundaries to increase our exposure to the general population.

All clubs must provide development officers to support the introduction of modcrosse in schools. We need enthusiastic role models who can promote our sport. It is the responsibility of all clubs to encourage young people to take up coaching roles and give back to the sport be it in paid or unpaid roles. Clubs also need to support any coaching clinics for coaches which are run with through our association.

My recommendations to clubs for the 2011 season include:

- 1. Encourage and nurture more development officers and support from club members, to increase our membership base.
- 2. To plan and prepare for 2011 season in January/ February with advertising for registrations before children enrol in other sports.
- 3. To be in regular contact with Director of Development in regard to target schools and groups, development officers, and issues and ideas which arise.

Finally, I encourage any enthusiastic person with new ideas for developing our great sport to apply for this position in the future.

2010 DIRECTOR OF PROMOTIONS REPORT – KAREN MAU

2010 was an extremely busy year for Western Australian Lacrosse in general. Certainly it has been a year of learning and development for all.

Investigations into how best to promote our sport of lacrosse are ongoing. Negotiations are in play with a community radio station to air a half hour segment per week promoting lacrosse as a whole as well as allowing clubs the chance to encourage, recruit players.

Awards Presentation Night: This year Lacrosse WA held a combined senior women's and men's presentation evening at Hillarys Yacht Club. I am pleased to report the evening was a success with strong representation from both men and women.
