As we approach the end of the 2012 lacrosse year in WA there are many positives to reflect on:

The return of the men's senior team to national competition,

Back to back national title for the senior women,

Participation at all other levels of national competition,

Facilitation of a club hosting a successful and well run national event,

Nine WA lads in the U19 Australian team

Three Officials selected for the U19 World Championship

Two Officials selected for the European Championship

A final series that culminated in a Grand Final Lacrosse spectacle the likes of which we have not seen before.

It is pleasing to note these successes. On a national and world stage we are doing quite well given the size of lacrosse in this state. However on the home front at local competition and local administration the year has provided many challenges.

It has been impossible for the Board to operate strategically when it was undermanned by 25% or more for more than 50% of the year. It is impossible to work strategically within the current system and balance of volunteer, employee ratio. Most of what had to be achieved during the year was achieved, the price being all Directors portfolio's being compromised by picking up tasks for areas where there was no Director, the end result being jobs that were done to a minimum standard and from the outside may well have looked like serious disorganization. I can assure you it was not disorganization, it was purely and simply overload.

LWA mission of 'providing leadership through the delivery of quality sports services and programs which ensure increasing participation for all levels of lacrosse (players, coaches, officials, administrators), and delivers national success is under serious threat because we continue to operate undermanned. It is becoming increasingly difficult to deliver expected services and meet funding outcomes because of this.

The first order of business for the new Board will be to locate and employ a person in an executive role, whose purpose will be to support the Board in their management of the game, and help to guide us in the direction of better management and improved development.

There is an urgent need to review all aspects of lacrosse administration, development and planning, and this cannot be achieved with a volunteer management structure.

LWA does continue to enjoy the support of the Department of Sport & Recreation and Healthway for various strategic, operational and development programs. As indicated previously, a positive from 2012 is that WA was represented at all national competitions. Congratulations to all players selected in those team and thank you to the people who picked up coaching, managerial and officiating roles for those teams and events.

Of particular note, Congratulations to the Senior Women's state team winning back to back national titles. This highly skilled, athletic and motivated team easily outplayed all the competition, the retention of the title was never in doubt. Congratulations to Coach Geoff Goddard and his team.

Thanks are extended to Phoenix Lacrosse Club for staging the 2012 ALA City Of Cockburn Senior National Championship and congratulations on the district support you gathered around that.

I offer our congratulations to the nine West Australian lads selected in the Australian U19 team who competed at the World Championship in Turku, Finland. This arena has always been a tough one for Australia. The commitment to this program is huge and often at a time when education is a major focus. Results aside, you should be proud of your achievement of selection in the team, managing a massive fund raising campaign and participation in this world event.

The deregistration of Lacrosse Australia (LA) was finalized during 2012. Trophies in the custody of the Australian Lacrosse Foundation (ALF) have been gifted to the Australian Lacrosse Association (ALA). There remains the matter of a Development Trust Fund to be matched, which will then see the completion of the national unification process.

As always many (although not enough) people have contributed to making lacrosse happen for you during the year.

Thanks to Ellen Kennedy for continuing to manage the office and the administration tasks within.

Sincere thanks to Margaret Morley for stepping back into lacrosse administration by accepting the role of Director of Finance halfway through the year.

To the club and association board members who worked tirelessly & diligently, behind the scenes and in the spotlight during the year to ensure we all have lacrosse to enjoy in WA, congratulations and thank you.

I look forward to 2013 being a year in which all clubs and members take up the challenge of being responsible for growing lacrosse, their game of choice.

In mid February A.L.A. advised that they had negotiated an Australia wide insurance coverage for Lacrosse. Whilst this had been discussed over the last year or so, its finalisation and request for payment came as a surprise to us. To ensure that the policy would meet all of W.A.'s requirements I took on the task of wading through the various insurances that may confront both clubs and L.W.A. in our operations.

Just as I was commencing my investigations one club requested confirmation about how much the Association's Public Liability cover was as their Local Government Authority required them to have cover of \$20 million. It was one of a number issues that I discovered over the next few months. My recommendation is to lift the public liability to \$20 million for 2013 season & to get onto the renewal of this policy early to prevent having a loan repayment that we had this year. Also follow up on the Club & L.W.A board indemnity insurance for 2013.

Club Presidents were kept regularly updated with the outcomes of my investigations and it would be my recommendation that as part of our Risk Management Strategy that L.W.A. conduct an annual survey of club and Association policies to ensure that we are all adequately covered for any outcome and that the costs of any policies are competitive.

Office Manager - Ellen Kennedy

I would like to thank the Board for allowing me to perform the role of "Office Manager". It has been both a challenge and a rewarding learning experience. 2012 has been a very interesting year for Lacrosse WA. I would like to give you a brief overview of the achievements of the year.

Lacrosse WA proudly supported by Healthway and the Smarter than Smoking message, continued its program of delivering Modcrosse to schools and community groups in the metropolitan area and to selected regional areas.

Our funding agreement with Healthway was renewed from July 2012 until June 2013. A new proposal will have to be resubmitted early next year for further funding. As part of our agreement, Lacrosse WA and its affiliated clubs will promote the smarter than smoking message, and must accept the following to provide a healthy and safe environment for its members:

- Provide a smoke free environment in clubrooms and around the playing areas;
- Reduce harm from alcohol;
- Provide healthy food choices as a step toward promoting healthy eating and body size;
- Promote sun smart practices;
- Provide a safe environment for club members.



Lacrosse WA addressed Healthway's target population of youth, regional areas, indigenous and disadvantaged populations. During the 2012 season our Development Officers presented approximately 750 Modcrosse sessions in 77 primary schools and 14 secondary schools in Western Australia.



Lacrosse WA needs all clubs to actively interact with schools in their area prior to the start of the season to maximise chances of recruitment. I would like to thank all the development officers who conducted sessions at schools and carnivals throughout the year, and special thanks to those who did work outside their club boundaries to increase our exposure to the general population and to address Healthway's target populations.

Modcrosse sessions in schools are our main avenue of recruitment so clubs need more enthusiastic people to become involved, whether it is coaching, umpiring or paid development work. Coaching workshops for players and development officers are crucial to increase knowledge base and skills. I would again like to thank Glenn Morley for running the A.L.A. Club Coaching Workshop before the start of the season, and encourage all new coaches and development officers to attend this high quality course in 2013.

At a national level, the Australian Lacrosse Association recently conducted a Junior Lacrosse Development workshop with representatives from all member states—Victoria, South Australia, NSW, Queensland, Tasmania and WA. Ideas were shared, and all member states agreed it was essential to work together to grow Lacrosse in Australia. An advisory council has been established to work on some key issues which came out of the workshop, and it is hoped a plan will evolve to roll out some national initiatives.

If all clubs and states can share our successes we have a huge potential for growth and development of our game. Good luck to clubs for 2013.

Where the Director of Officiating was previously appointed by nomination of ALRA, the position is now available for any applicant.

This change coincides with work by the ALA Officiating Director, Graham Sharpe, to establish more structured organisation for umpires of Women's Lacrosse.

This year a Women's National Technical Committee was formed including Suzanne Kirkby from WA. This body will provide representation and technical advice to the ALA in regard to umpiring of Women's Lacrosse.

ALRA has long had such structures in WA and Australia.

After 2 years in the job, I hope that my replacement is better able than I was to focus specifically on the growth and stability of umpiring Women's Lacrosse in WA.

The Women's World Cup is being held next year in Oshawa in Canada. Selection for umpires for that event takes into account the performance of umpires at the recent National Championships.

In Men's Lacrosse, workshops were scheduled to enable clubs to have their 'club referees' to be instructed in the requirements and basic mechanics of refereeing, followed by a simple rule knowledge exam.

On behalf of ALRA, Laslo Tiszavolgyi again conducted an officiating course at the West Coast TAFE.

During the season ALRA WA Members attended and did coaching reports on Club and Panel Referees. This required the observation of the match, recording of faults and compilation of a formal report to the referee, explaining the rules and offering advice on how to use the various mechanics. Such work is vital in the performance and development of referees in WA.

At the national level WA officials have again been well to the forefront in the manner in which they conduct themselves and compare to referees/umpires from other states.

At the National under 15 competition, WA was represented by umpire Kellie McBean for the girls, and in the boy's competition by, and David McRae and Brayden Borbely, with Laslo Tiszavolgyi and Evan Walters assessing.

At the under 18 competition WA was represented by Bruce Banyard and John Keesing, with Laslo Tiszavolgyi assessing in the men's and Nicole McKenna umpired for the women's game.

At the Senior Competition, Women's Lacrosse umpires were Stephanie McRae, Suzanne Kirkby and Nicole McKenna.

In the Senior Men's, WA referees were Steve McRae, who was Head referee for the Final, Peter Mulcahy, Bruce Banyard and I. Evan Walters, the Referee in Chief for the Championship, and also for WA, was also an assessor, as were Ian McRae and Laslo Tiszavolgyi.

WA referees performed international duties with Steve McRae and Mitchell Walmsley being chosen for the Under 19 World Championship in Turku, Finland. Peter Mulcahy and I were chosen to referee at the European Cup in Amsterdam.



Director of Men's Lacrosse-Ian McRae

In commencing my report I would like to thank all those people who have helped and guided me through my first year as Director. Having been around for a while I was surprised at the intricacies of the position.

In planning for the season I originally envisaged the conduct of a Coaching Conference but after concerns about the lack of possible attendees opted instead to encourage the conduct of a Level one coaching course. This was held at Bayswater under the guidance of facilitator Glenn Morley with 10 participants.

To develop and expand the knowledge base and skills of all our coaches we must conduct a Coaching Conference at least bi-annually. One critical area that needs to be evolved is a skills continuum — what players need to be able to perform, what tactical knowledge should they possess and at what stage (grade) they should be able to do so. There should not be any player reaching senior grade competition without being able to catch / throw with both hands and understand about body positioning defence.

The season's fixtures saw a disjointed year – with a number of byes early in the season and it was not until after the July school holidays that it appeared to flow better.

After a tentative start in the Under 17 grade, East Fremantle determined that it was not practicable to continue fielding a team and after the first round withdrew. In re-drawing the fixture consideration was taken about relocating games to a venue where only the Under 17 teams would be playing and also the distance they would then need to travel should the players also play in a senior grade later; so a number of games where played at Preston Point and I thank the East Fremantle club for allowing it and also to those members who put the ground equipment out.

It would appear that a few minor changes to the Association's rules regarding junior teams, some years back has resulted in a negative impact on the provision of suitable numbers at the Under 17 level. The next five or so years will be difficult for this grade and will put us under pressure to field teams at the national and players to the international level.

Two applications were received from two clubs requesting permission to allow over aged players to play in the Under 13 grade. One application was received requesting an under aged player to play up. Given the circumstances of each case the Junior Council representatives resolved (on this occasion) to allow the over aged players into the Under 13 grade, under strict conditions, The one application to play up was declined in line with the minimum age policy of the Association.

With changes to school starting ages and the introduction of year seven students into high school in 2015 it is appropriate to review our Junior grading structure to ensure that we have an accessible entry levels for new members.

This year saw the conduct of the F.I.L. Under 19 World Championships in Turku, Finland and for the first time all W.A. clubs had at least one representative in the Australian Team. Although not as successful as the members had expected they all came away with a wealth of Lacrosse knowledge and many opportunities to follow up.

At an Australia level, for the first time in three years, W.A. was able to field teams in all national Men's competitions. Most heartening was the number of people who put their names forward to fill the positions of coach and assistant coach.

Following a number of issues with the separate Under 17 and Under 19 competitions over recent years the Australian Lacrosse Association resolved to conduct a two year trial by combining these two events into an Under 18 Championships.

After a late start a Western Australian team was formed and due to this the team under coach Robert Gibbs is to be congratulated for the manner in which they contested the final against Victoria and came away with the silver medal. There is a proposal to bring this championship forward to April in 2013.

The Under 15 Tournaments were conducted in Victoria and in a first all matches played on artificial turf at the Footscray Hockey ground. The impact of an unfamiliar field cannot be underestimated on young players and the standard of play suffered. Northern Thunder finished fourth and the Southern Braves were unable to continue their dominance of the past years, slipping to 6th.

In their first appearance after two years absence our senior men's team failed to penetrate strong S.A. and Victorian defences and it was only some outstanding goaltending that prevented W.A. from suffering bigger margins in their defeats. The attacking plays of all our clubs needs to be overhauled – the concept of passing around until someone gets bored and takes on three plus defenders needs to be thrown out and replaced with the 'old' cutting, picking and accurate passing and even accurate shooting. Coaches it is back to you, take up the challenge!

During the season two rule changes were implemented – The 10 second rule was removed and the F.I.L. nominated goalkeeper rule replaced our cumbersome stop / start goalkeeper replacement. The changeover was smooth and easily adopted by all players. In early October ALA adopted our recommendation that the 10 second rule be deleted from national competition and this will apply from 2013.

The standard of sportsmanship in Lacrosse, I believe, is higher than many other sports here in W.A. but we must remain ever vigilant in ensuring that our players are warriors on the field and friends off. Our sport is too small to allow petty dislikes to grow into bitter, festering antagonism.

Acknowledge good play, great goals and even better saves of both contesting teams and respect your fellow participant, for he affords you the opportunity to become a better lacrosse player.



President's Report

As I mentioned above, 2012 was mixed year on the field. However off the field I believe great strides were made. Elected President, Peter Cann introduced many changes to the way the Club operated, resulting with much more efficient and effective structures and processes. I took over as President when Peter had to resign. He and I have been ably supported by a strong and enthusiastic committee who have implemented many changes and achieved great success in the process. I thank them most sincerely for their contributions to the club.

Some of the major initiatives are:

- Use of online registration and payment systems
- Introduction of 'cost centres' and EFTPOS facilities
- Upgrading of our merchandising processes
- Introduction of 'Blues Bucks' as rewards
- Development of sound working arrangements with the EF Town Council and our co-tenants,
 the EF Cricket Club
- Appointment of a sub-committee with the Cricket Club to consider extensions or renovations to our club rooms
- Introduction of a Modcrosse/Lacrosse Festival to be played at our ground on Wed evenings through Term 4 this year and Term 1 next year.
- Development of a club strategic plan.

As a result of these initiatives there were a number of highlights which I want to mention. For the first time in my long experience with EFLC, all fees (including many 'back' fees) were paid by the end of June. We also had a better handle on the profits being accrued from the bar, canteen and merchandise sales. This gave us confidence that we were in a sound financial position for the year.

The modifications to the club rooms are part of a longer term project involving the Dept of Sport and Recreation, the Town of East Fremantle, the EF Cricket Club and EFLC. It involves the Cricket Club and us agreeing on what we want in the new clubrooms, having concept plans drawn up, obtaining costs, getting grants from DSR, approval from the Town of EF and then going ahead with the changes (if we can afford them). To date we have appointed a subcommittee, chaired by Peter Cann and with Dave Miller on it and Ann Gosling as secretary along with Cricket Club representatives and a number of crucial meetings have been held and plans are moving ahead.

Strategic planning is an integral component of club administration. Strategic planning helps to outline the mission, goals and direction of the club to assist in achieving common goals and objectives as set by our membership. Strategy also helps to outline the steps the club will take to achieve its mission. Our first Strategic Planning session was held on the 30th September 2012. Dave Miller has taken a leading role in this and the club should be indebted to him for his efforts and enthusiasm.

The Modcrosse/Lacrosse Festival is an initiative to recruit more juniors in the 9 to 15 age group. Approaches have been made to primary and high schools in our area with a view to attracting potential new players to our Club. Initially we are hopeful of recruiting 30 plus new players for 2013, however our longer term objective is for many more than this in future years as we gain more experience and develop a better 'product' to sell to school children. We are looking to senior players to help out with coaching and refereeing on the Wed evenings. Bev Leavy has done a great job with this project.

Sponsors of our club are vital in helping us keep our fees to members to a reasonable level and still undertake necessary development work. We are fortunate to have many generous supporters who we acknowledge and thank for their interest.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of this club and we are fortunate to have a great band of them at EFLC. There are too many to mention individually however I take this opportunity to thank them for their efforts in 2013. We endeavoured to thank as many as possible recently with an evening cruise on the river. This was a very enjoyable event and special thanks go to Chris Hockey who put his boat at our disposal. Two of our stalwarts, Anne-Marie Hall and Charlie Wemyss, who have given great service to the Club in many capacities and over a long period, were awarded Certificates of Merit at the windup.

As can be seen, there is a lot happening at EFLC and many opportunities for people to get involved. I ask all those who helped in 2012 to do so again in 2013 and those who perhaps are still thinking of getting involved to contact any of the committee and I am sure we can find a suitable job. Thirdly Phoenix has a culture of paying their fees when they fall due. If this positive culture had not been in place, Phoenix would have disappeared a long time ago, as our club has not had a bar or kitchen for many years.

Teams:

Phoenix had a successful year on field; the Club played in three grand finals and won two junior flags. In 2012 we identified that our Under 13 boys team would only have 4 players (including one girl).

Grant Moir, Darren Grayson and Luke McCallum quickly set about hitting all the schools in our local area; by the end of 2013 we had 20 players.

This team (with sixteen 1st year players) went on to win the grand final, which was an extraordinary fairy-tale.

Our Under 12 girl's team (s) was once again the main stay of the competition. **Gerard and Annabel Wills**, along with **Roxanne Leavy** ensured that the future for our Under 16 girl's team was assured.

Many of these players will graduate to Under 16's in 2014.

Kira and Fran Maunton managed to "blood and blend" many of these smaller girls in the Under 16 team. They also ensured that each week the Phoenix team never won by a large margin in this grade despite the overwhelming strength of the team. This was a credit to their sportsmanship. Despite for once having "the boot on the other foot" they never drove it home.

Our Under 16 girls went on to win the Grand final.

Our Men's Division 3 team of old stalwarts scrapped through to the Grand final only to be beaten in overtime. As testament to the goodwill the team showed all year, every player made the effort to come to the presentation and applaud Wembley for their magnificent grand final win.

Our State league team once again struggled to score and failed to win a game for the 2nd year in a row despite restructuring our coaching staff. Special thanks to Travis Roost and Dave Robinson for their efforts coaching the team in 2013.

The Future:

State League: To date they have won less than 6 games in the past 10 years. Sadly this history has taken its toll on our younger players. There would not be too many players from other clubs that would keep coming back with a record like that. Despite the lack of success, some of our young players keep coming back week after week. Our Club needs has struggled to address this situation.

The competition within Western Australia has dropped off dramatically, nowhere was it more evident than in the Nationals, where our State came perilously close to being beaten by the Presidents team. Our State's, in fact Australia's rapid decline, can only be reversed by having healthy competition at a local level. Lopsided results have seen many players leave the game, whilst some players from the dominant clubs appear to be content to play in the lower grades, rather than migrate. Perhaps it is time to starting importing more talented International players to raise the tone and skill of our game locally? At this stage Phoenix are still trying find one other coach to restructure their coaching staff around **David Robinson** and **Todd Whisson**.

Division 3: This grade has become a very important grade to our club. We have found that this grade encourages men in their late 30's and 40's to remain active within the club. Men of this age are better placed to have a bigger impact on the club structure, culture and organization. Division 3 also allows our club to introduce the fathers (A reserve...the mothers) of new juniors to become involved in the game. Perhaps Division 3 (or A reserve in women's) is the most important grade within WA Lacrosse as it encourages involvement by people who are more likely to contribute to the welfare of the game as a whole.

Junior Boys: Phoenix ambitiously plans to increase the number of Under 13 teams we have to two. We have seen the on flow benefits when Wanneroo had this sometime ago. Phoenix also plans to have an Under 15 team next year. Under 17's will have to wait until 2014/15.

Senior Women: Our A Grade ladies narrowly missed their first ever Grand final appearance by one goal to East Fremantle. Given most of our players are still around 18/19 they should give a good account for themselves. **Jen Kerford** has been elected the coach for Phoenix in 2013.

Junior Girls: Phoenix has had two Under 12 girls' teams for a few years now. We hope to field two in 2013 again and our Under 16's should be well represented.

ALRA WA is languishing and membership is at a critical level.

Since my involvement with ALRA began some 12 years ago, there has been a continual ask of clubs to fulfil their obligation as per the Association Rules to supply members to ALRA to serve as referees. In fact that is how my involvement initially began.

ALRA members have run courses to get people endorsed to referee and spent countless hours going to games to mentor those who take on the duties of officiating each week on behalf of their club in the games that ALRA Panel Referees are unable to cover due to our lack of numbers. Many of those that do the job of officiating each week are not endorsed to do so – that is they have not attended or passed any of the courses run, and others are not prepared to heed advise offered when we attend their games to view their on-field performances.

Players never seem to lack in offering criticism of the performance of referees each week, yet many of the accredited referees that make up ALRA WA have had National and International experience. ALRA WA's membership level has been stagnant for years. Too much reliance is being placed on too few to keep performing when their bodies are getting older and finding it harder to endure the rigours of officiating at the top level. In most countries the average age of a referee would be 30 to 35. In Australia that age would be closer to 45 to 48.

We are in no different a situation to any other level of the Association. There are too few willing to put up their hands (to do the work), but never a shortage of those willing to criticise. No doubt we will continue on for better or for worse for our love of the game.

It is testimony to me of the state of the game in Australia and why we are languishing behind the leaders at International level.

But for the game to prosper needs a more pro-active approach from those involved in playing the game at club level and especially those who are considering putting their gear away so they can simply sit on the sideline and continue the cycle.
