PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year saw a shift in focus by LWA from representational lacrosse to that of recruitment. For a long time now, many clubs have been struggling to field full teams without the assistance of players playing up a grade or two. At our very first meeting of Club Presidents this year, there was a unanimous vote for focusing on recruitment. To that extent, the Board of Lacrosse WA held a strategic planning session, from which came the vision for lacrosse in WA, and that is:

"Lacrosse is the fastest growing sport getting ready for the Olympics".

This is a lofty ambition, and one that sets our sights very high, as it should. Underpinning this vision, there are five strategies, namely:

- 1. Marketing, promotion and branding
- 2. Sponsorship
- 3. Development
- 4. Professionalism
- 5. Operations

We hit the ground running with our first strategy, when we held the Gala Opening of the 2014 Lacrosse Season at the Royal Yacht Club in Nedlands to celebrate not only the upcoming year but also the outstanding successes at National level from the previous year. We then ensured that all games results were published in the Sunday Times and Monday's West Australian and also posted to LWA's Facebook page each night to keep members updated.

The Department of Sport and Recreation and the Department of Health continued their great financial sponsorship of this game at a state level with many clubs also getting local business sponsorship. This has allowed us to support membership growth by covering the costs of the Development Officers who can go out to schools and run clinics and to also improve the administrative support at the LWA office.

Our main drive on recruitment happened through the great development program run by Peta Hiron and our Director of Development, Grant Moir. Together, they have seen a 20% increase in player numbers, following a careful analysis of actual players by grade and excluding players who play up. This is a fantastic result that we look to build on next year.

In our Junior Development, we saw great innovation, with the second year of trial development of the U11 competition with four clubs, led by Phoenix, and supported by Subiaco, Bayswater and East Fremantle. Judging by the response from players and parents, it has been an overwhelming success, and a logical progression from Modcrosse to boy's 13's and girl's D Grade.

For our Senior Mens and Womens, it has been a mixed year, with some clubs fielding strong sides in all grades and others





struggling. However, pride in the clubs remains strong and the end of year finals were a great success, and a fitting tribute to the men and women of the East Fremantle Lacrosse Club. One of the highlights of the finals was live video streaming of the finals onto YouTube, which made viewing of the game accessible to many around Australia and the world. We also welcomed the Singapore Lacrosse Club to our shores during the club finals, creating a nice international atmosphere for the players and supporters.

The highlight of the year for me was the U15 National Lacrosse Tournament held at Success Regional Sporting Facility. It was a wonderful example of a well thought out program, innovative education programs and a fantastic setting for girls and boys to play lacrosse. I want to personally thank Fran Maunton as Vice President LWA and Tournament Director and Annabel Wills, LWA Director for Administration for an exceptionally well run tournament and for their tireless efforts in making this an event to remember by all. The support that came from the City of Cockburn was remarkable and LWA looks to foster the growing support for the game in this rapidly growing region of Perth.

Next year I want to keep the focus on recruitment and growth in lacrosse, particularly at the junior level and continue to look for ways to make the game exciting to all the players and supporters so that they tell their friends about this great game.

Finally I want to thank the Board for all their efforts this year and to the LWA office, ably run by Roxanne Leavy, who provided exceptional support to me, in my first year as President of Lacrosse WA.

Thank you for the privilege of leading this sport, and as I said at the SGM in February this year, I am here to:

- 1. Grow membership across all clubs,
- Listen to the needs of clubs and to serve them as best as possible
- Build on the great pride within the clubs and its members to promote the game to a wider audience.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

U15 Nationals Championships

Hosted by Phoenix Lacrosse Club on behalf of LWA at Success Regional Sports Centre.

A total of 17 teams participated in the competitions, 7 boys and 10 girls' teams, including an ALA President Team in each competition; and a team of 30 Officials managing the games.

Generous funding and facilities provided by the City of Cockburn and the WA Department of Sport & Recreation enabled us to contract administration support and work toward implementing several initiatives approved by the ALA. Initiatives which included expanding the Welcome Function to include all participants, host the Opening Ceremony the evening before the commencement of competition and introduce Education and Social programs which were developed to facilitate learning, social interaction between teams and lift the atmosphere and vibrancy of this event.

The overall preparation and programming incorporated the use of a specific web site, social media and Team App as a means of communication with everyone involved, in addition to live streaming several games and each of the Grand Finals in full, meant that people in the competition and all over the world could be almost instantly kept up to date with the results.

As the country's biggest national event that aims to provide opportunity for as many young people as possible to participate, we/LWA felt there were several aspects that are important to incorporate, improve and expand:

- Expand participation from within Member States and overseas as much as possible
- Maintain a participation and development focus among players, team staff & officials
- 3. Incorporate opportunity to meet and social with opponents.
- Incorporate learning that will support these players in life, and especially if they choose an elite pathway.



- 5. Make use of current technology to make everyone's experience better, provide opportunity for worldwide viewing and expand promotion of the game.
- 6. Make use of current technology to improve ours, and future organiser's ability to secure commercial funding.

Codes of Conduct

Some serious complaints about player and spectator behaviour during the season gave cause for us to revisit the Codes of Conduct, their relevance and implementation. Resulting from this, the Board provided updated copies of the Codes of Conduct to each club, sufficient to provide each of their members with a copy and urged clubs to both have these on hand for parents, supporters and new members and ensure the active adoption of them within their club philosophy.

Further support resources provided were enlarged copies of the Codes of Conduct for display in club rooms and A frame signs for display at home grounds reminding all that 'These are kids, This is a game, The coaches are volunteers, The officials are human, This is not the FIL World Cup'. Our hope is that actively promoting these will remind everyone that the primary outcome of participating in sport is enjoyment for everyone concerned.

Fairest & Best Voting

A review of the recording and process of Fairest & Best voting was conducted mid-season, aiming to ensure that the process is manageable for all and recording of the information is confidential. This has required some alteration to age old ways of doing things, but in the interest of ensuring confidentiality and ultimately prestige for the resultant awards, members and officials are encouraged to embrace them and/or offer constructive assistance to further improve the process.

Policy Statements

There were several instances during the year that highlighted a lack of process or knowledge of how specific tasks and events were expected to be managed. Things like the Junior Council, Life Member Review Panel, Finals Hosting etc lack a clear idea, or written policy of what is expected from all parties in terms of minimum standards and organisation. As a result it has been recommended that within the Vice President's role, review of the following be undertaken to provide draft Terms of Reference:

- Junior & Senior Lacrosse Councils
- Life Member Review Committee Submissions Review
- Presentation Functions Junior & Senior
- Finals Hosting
- Nationals Hosting

The expected outcome being that LWA ultimately has a standard documented set of instructions so that all parties involved are clear about what is required of them.

What an exciting year the Administration team has had this year.

We have also progressed through the Constitution and Strategic Plan review projects and, following extensive consultation in the new year would see these processes completed in the first half of next year.

The final project for the LWA office is the development and documentation of policies and procedures. This project should also be completed early in 2015.

The ongoing aims for 2015 for the office are to continue to provide high quality, timely, professional and friendly services to the lacrosse community of WA and to provide the ongoing support to the Board Directors to facilitate the Board being able to operate at a strategic level.

The Sub Committee met bi-monthly and discussed various issues throughout the season to ensure communication and professionalism was maintained across the women's competition, reporting back to the Lacrosse WA Board.

There are various issues the women's competition needs to continue improving upon and I look forward to working with clubs to ensure we keep striving for excellence. Over the last few



seasons the Women's Sub Committee have dealt with mainly operational issues and it is a goal for 2015 for us to work on a number of global women's lacrosse issues to ensure our future survival.

The Women's Sub Committee is appreciative of the work undertaken by the Junior Lacrosse Council this season in taking the D Grade competition from strength to strength. Numbers in this grade continue to grow and all clubs should be congratulated for their efforts in recruitment and retention. The sportsmanship showed by the youngest members of our game must be commended. Their season culminated in an end of year presentation which was enjoyed by both players and parents.

In season 2014 we welcomed the addition of two extra A Reserve Teams, this widened the competition to nine teams which created a small fixturing headache. To ensure all teams completed two full rounds a "Super Round" was held in June (A Grade bye due to Senior Championships in Adelaide). On this day A Reserve teams played a maximum of 3 shortened games. Reports received from players and officials were complimentary of the format and the Women's Sub Committee will look to fine tune this "Super Round" if it is required in the 2015 fixtures. My thanks are expressed to Karen Mau for her operational assistance and Bev Leavy for undertaking time keeping.

During the season competitive games were played across all grades, our close results in many of the finals were testament to the hard fought competition we have here in WA. We were very lucky to have few wet Sunday's this year which made playing games a more enjoyable experience.

Thank you to East Fremantle Lacrosse Club and their organising committee for the 2014 finals series, it will be remembered for many reasons, including the addition of demonstration games for juniors and the visit from Singapore Lacrosse.

Phoenix Lacrosse Club hosted a spectacular Under 15
Tournament and have really set the bar high for future
tournaments of this nature. The week displayed some sensational
lacrosse, terrific sportsmanship, wonderful weather and a team
of volunteers that did not stop to ensure the success of their
Tournament, congratulations to Fran Maunton, Annabel Wills,
Colin Moir and all Phoenix members.

Thank you to our Coaches and Managers of our State and Regional Teams, without volunteers for these positions the teams would not be in a position to attend Championships. WA was also well represented at a National level with umpires attending all Championships and the U15 Tournament.

I look forward to entering my final year as Director of Women's Lacrosse and tackling the obstacles that continue to halt our progress forward. The Lacrosse WA Board has many areas to review and policies to implement between now and next season and with these in place, I hope that we can continue to present a professional and well operated competition for all members to enjoy.

2014 DIRECTOR OF OFFICIATIONS REPORT

This past season has seen much work in building and consolidating the development of a dedicated officiating group within women's lacrosse in Western Australia and Australia. Initiatives commenced over the past few years are slowly starting to promote the rewards of good officiating within the game and also the career path that is now available with the growth of lacrosse worldwide.

At Australian level, the Women's National Technical Committee has been formed and representatives are now working at forming their state Australian Lacrosse Officials Association, based upon the men's ALRA body and constitution.

An evaluation form has been developed and accepted for use next year by coaches in women's games to help provide regular feedback to match officials.

Over the last two years WA women's lacrosse has accredited more state and national umpires than other states. This bodes well for the development of the game. Their match fees have been increased. An umpire's panel or an umpires subcommittee is to be implemented next year.

Grant Moir, through the Junior Lacrosse Council, proposed and introduced an officiating program, which aimed to familiarize junior players with officiating. Its long-term aim is to improve the rule knowledge and quantity of officials at junior grades. Stephanie McRae and Bruce Banyard developed a Log Book for participants to use. Both the Men's Chief Referee and Women's Umpire in Chief maintain oversight of the approval for any endorsements to be issued.

During the season ALRA WA have accredited over 100 club and ALRA members to officiate games at the various grades. Arrangements are being made to facilitate the annual theory test at a national level via Arbiter.

ALA has accepted the Men's National Technical Committee's recommendation for a career path and selection criteria for national and international championships for both referees and assessors.

This year saw the Men's Senior World Championships take place in Denver, USA. ALRA – WA members selected to officiate were Peter Mulcahy and Blair Fraser with Evan Walters as an Assessor. Steven McRae, on his own initiative, attended the US Lacrosse's LAREDO (Lacrosse Referee Development program), which was held immediately prior and also officiated in the Festival of Lacrosse conducted in conjunction with the Worlds.

Congratulations to Ben Mercer of the East Fremantle Lacrosse Club who was awarded the ALRA-WA Junior Referee Development Scholarship, which enabled him to officiate in the 2014 Australian Under 15 Tournament.

2014 DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

2014 has been a year of change and growth for junior lacrosse in WA. With the continued support of Healthway 'Smarter Than Smoking' program, we have had some great success stories in our junior ranks in 2014.

The Smarter than Smoking (STS) Modcrosse in Schools Program continued to provide us with an effective means to promote healthy lifestyles as well as the sport of lacrosse. I believe that our STS Development Officers have done a great job in spreading the Smarter than Smoking message, while being wonderful ambassadors for lacrosse. This is obvious with both the numbers of players joining club modcrosse and lacrosse competitions, as well as the positive feedback we receive from school teaching staff who work with our DO's.

All clubs were well represented with development officers and they included visiting international players, students, and part time workers. A brief summary of the year's work includes

- Schools visited: 95
- Modcrosse introduced to: approx 27,000 boys and girls.
- Carnivals involving the following school sporting associations: South of the River, Catholic Schools, Cockburn Central, South Central, Bayswater-Upper Swan/Beechboro, Kingsway-Wanneroo/Hillarys/ Woodvale, Rockingham/Warnbro, Cambridge, Blues Modcrosse Carnival, Wolves Modcrosse Carnival.
- Work with community groups YMCA, "Have a Go Days", Recreation Centres
- Joondalup Teacher In-service
- School Holiday Clinics

The first few changes started at the Junior Lacrosse Council level. In January the Council became the decision-making and strategic planning body for both junior men's and women's lacrosse in WA. The LWA Director of Development was charged with its coordination, and the JLC delegates agreed to the scope and processes of decisions and planning. The recommendations and discussion points from the 'Junior Lacrosse in WA – A Shared Vision' meeting, which was held at Rosalie Park in December 2013, were used to provide direction for the Council in 2014.

The directorship of Development experienced a number of changes to its structure in 2014. Peta Hiron took on the role of Development Manager, which allowed her to continue to provide effective support to the STS Development Officers, as well as collaboration with Healthway and schools. To provide further support to our band of hard-working club junior coordinators, the Lacrosse WA Board agreed to create a new part-time Club Junior Recruitment Officer position. In this role, April Jolly has provided the Association with more accurate baseline data on player numbers in WA, while assisting clubs in junior recruitment and development.

At the beginning of 2014, the JLC undertook a review of the playing rules of the D Grade Women's competition. This process gave all clubs an opportunity for input into the review of the rules and after a couple of months was fully endorsed by the JLC, Women's Umpire-In-Chief and LWA. One aspect of this review brought about a change in the playing age groups to align them with school years (D Grade – Year 1-7; C Grade – Year 5-11). The JLC see the future creation of a third junior age grouping as a priority for Women's lacrosse

The Australian Lacrosse Association has recommended that all coaches, regardless of division are accredited through the ALA Coaching Course. In 2014, two of these courses were held - Sunday 2nd March @ Halliday and Monday 9th & 16th June @ Light Street; with 32 coaches and school development officers gaining accreditation. Many thanks to ALA Director of Coaching, Glenn Morley for his efforts in presenting both courses.

As a sport we are lucky enough to have some world-class umpires and referees here in WA, but unfortunately (or alarmingly) we also starting to see a decline in experienced officials. The JLC identified this situation as an area of priority, and throughout 2014, with the assistance of Suzanne Kirkby, Steph McRae and Bruce Banvard, devised the Junior Lacrosse Officiating Program, This program has already provided a group of junior lacrosse players the opportunity to officiate junior games and to gain mentoring and levels of accreditation from experienced senior officials. Lacrosse WA pledged its support for the program through the provision of match payments for these officials, once accredited. Both the JLC and LWA Board see these payments as one means of encouraging junior players to experience umpiring and refereeing. By the end of 2014, there were approximately 6 junior players who had passed their first phase of accreditation, with many others keen to follow their lead in 2015.

"We wanna play box." This statement has been repeated by many of our junior members over years and this year our 15's and 17's boys were given a first taste of this exciting form of the game. The JLC, together with a group of senior men's players coordinated a Box Lacrosse Exhibition Night at Claremont Showgrounds during the bye round in July. Approximately 60 Junior and Senior Men's players participated in this event, with an audience that would rival a finals fixture. Such was the popularity of this event, there is already widespread support to expand this concept in 2015.

The LWA Junior Lacrosse Gala Day, held in July brought the three entry-level formats of the game (D Grade, Under 11's Lacrosse and Modcrosse) together at one venue. Eighteen teams participated in three separate round-robin competitions for the morning. It was a magnificent sight to see roughly 180 junior-aged boys and girls playing on the one ground. Many old-time lacrosse players said

that the day brought them back to the golden days of Saturday morning junior lacrosse at Rosalie Park in the 70's and 80's. Once again, the collaboration amongst the JLC representatives was vital to the success of this event.

The LWA Junior Wind-Up, held at Rosalie Park was a fitting culmination event to a great season of junior lacrosse. Fastest Shot Competitions, autographed posters of Australian players, and a great slide show put together by April Jolly gave the kids a night to remember. Many thanks to Subiaco Lacrosse Club for hosting the event, the JLC, also to our Australian representatives: Thomas Graham, Warren Brown and Elizabeth 'Buzzy' Hinkes for providing inspiration to our future stars.

Our player numbers at the all-important entry-level competitions (Modcrosse, D Grade and U11's Lacrosse) have continued to show pleasing rates of growth in 2014. In 2014 the U13's competition expanded to 8 teams with Wembley and Phoenix fielding two teams each. While this was a great achievement for these clubs, it did create a disparity of results between these teams and singular club teams, with a high number of 'blow-out' results. As these unattractive results were not limited to this age division, the JLC has begun to look at possible manifestations of the mercy rule for implementation in junior grades in 2015.

While it has been great to see all of the growth in our grass-roots levels, it must also be said that clubs and the Board need to continue to look for new ways to provide more support for the junior club coordinators who have overseen this growth in player numbers. While these people have a strong love of the game, it is incumbent on clubs to ensure they are properly supported to prevent the common scenario of 'junior coordinator burn-out'. While lacrosse is not a sport that new mums and dads would be able to step in and 'take a junior team', there are a wide range of

tasks performed by the coordinators (managing, ground set-up, uniform registrar, promotions, canteen, time keeper, scorer) that could fulfilled by other members, new and long-term. Making new and existing members accountable to continuing the healthy growth of this sport in WA will not be an easy task, but one which needs to be performed if we are to continue to grow the game.

As Director of Development, I would personally like to acknowledge the tireless efforts of our Junior Lacrosse Council representatives: Amanda Plummer, Russell Panting (Wembley), Bev Leavy (EF), Helen Moir (Phoenix), Angie Somerville, John Newton (Subiaco), Darren Sugars, Dennis Holman (Wanneroo), Glenn Coulter, Des Doherty (Bayswater), April Jolly (LWA) and Bruce Banyard (ALRAWA). The level of collaboration shown amongst this group of people has provided a shared direction for the development of the sport in WA. They have been a great bunch of people to work with.

I would also like to thank Peta Hiron (Development Manager, LWA) for everything that she has put in to the development of junior lacrosse in WA; and Ian McRae for his work in coordinating the Junior Lacrosse Council for the years leading up to 2014. It would be interesting to see what this sport would look like today without the efforts of these two people.

In conclusion, it is clear to see that recruitment has been a focus for the six clubs, and we are making pleasing progress at the entry level. It must also be said that strategies to improve the retention of existing players must also be a priority in the future, if we are to sustain three men's and two women's senior divisions well into the future. The evidence shown over the last 12 months that clubs are willing to work together for a common goal is a positive start.

The Stars team who finished 5th in 2013 went through the tournament undefeated and won the tournament's final game against Vic Ice to become the 2014 ALA Tournament winners. 2014 DIRECTOR OF PROMOTION'S REPORT

This was my first official year on the board of Lacrosse WA (after 2 years supporting in the marketing space) and personally I found it to be both educational and rewarding. My vision in this role is to change the perception of Lacrosse WA as an association and build capacity within the membership. My main objectives were;

- Engage the current Lacrosse WA membership through social media and events
- Support and up skill the clubs to be more proactive within their own local marketing
- Grow the game through other marketing and the media external to the Smarter Than Smoking Schools Development Program
- Produce a marketing plan to make all of the above possible

Lacrosse WA kicked off the season with the inaugural *Season Launch* which was held at Royal Perth Yacht Club in March. The aim of the event was to get players, coaches, supporters, local Politicians and the general community excited about the season ahead. Teams were also recognized from the 2013 Season and congratulated on their achievements. The event was also used to celebrate and send off the 2014 Under 18 Girls and Boys team before they left Perth in April for the National Championships.

A PR seminar was held in April open to all clubs hosted by myself and PR expert Keira Swayn from The Salvation Army's marketing department. Massive thanks to Ryan Spark from East Fremantle Lacrosse Club for getting this initiative off the ground and ongoing support to Lacrosse WA in this space.



U15 GIRLS NATIONAL TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS 2014 - STARS




